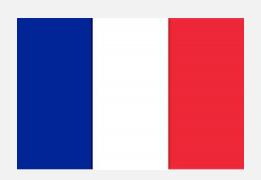

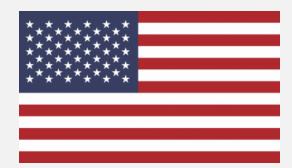

TRIAL PERIOD

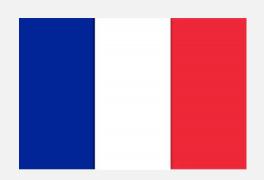


- Not required
- Strict process
- Different as per the type of contract and the professional category
- Possibility of one renewal



- Usally 90 days
- No condition if employment at will
- Except volation of protected class (such as race, sex, age, pregnancy or religion, etc.)

FLEXIBLE WORKING



- Legal working time
- Overtime: increased to 25 % (i.e. from 36th to 43rd) and increased to 50 % (without exceeding 48 hours)
- Full-time at 35 hours and part-time at 24 hours
- Lunch break: more longer breaks



- No limits number of hours
- Overtime : paid at 1.5 times

- Full-time and part-time is not clearly defined
- Lunch break : about 30 minutes

REMUNERATION



- Federal minimum wage : 10,03 € / hour
- Payment monthly
- Taxes and social security contributions deducted from wages



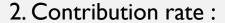
- Federal minimum wage: 7\$25 / hour Each state is free to set it's own hourly rate
- Payment monthly, weekly or every two weeks
- Only taxes deducted from wages

Taxes are levied at withholding tax

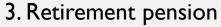
I. The same system organization :

- Universal



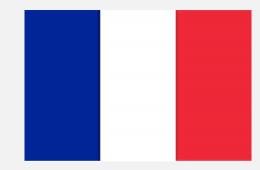
France: Social Security bracket and status

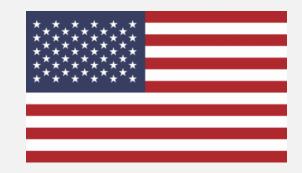
United States: Single contribution rate of 12,4 %
